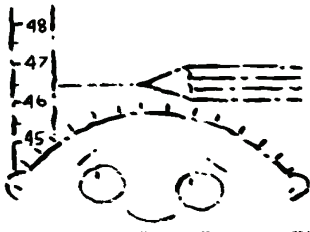

Greetings from our home and church in Nairobi

Cindy finally made it to the States. We were both supposed to go for our son's wedding last month, but the unpronounceable volcano prevented that from happening. We along with millions of fellow sojourners were grounded. It was a bitter disappointment but the mother of the groom is now very happy to be back with the newlyweds.

I have mentioned before that many of our members come from the vast slums of Dagoretti, an area just behind our church grounds. Each week Cindy and I, together with other members of our HIV/AIDS support group, go into Dagoretti on home visits.

It seems to me that the slum is not dissimilar to the mud hut arrangements corrugated iron roofs that can be found in villages all over rural Kenya. But in the slum the houses are tiny affairs, usually no more than one room, and there is no view, no trees, no grass, no space, just thousands of people with many sanitation problems. There is rubbish dumped randomly, open sewage, goats, sheep, cows, chickens and dogs mingle freely. One is advised to be careful where one steps. And yet, children of God live here, fall in love here, set up households, raise fine young children. It is a place where one can celebrate the human spirit as people prevail over a most difficult set of circumstances.

Dagoretti is not a place to be pitied. It is as much of a community as Elm street in any city, USA. There are busy, thriving enterprises; a maize grinding shop, a place to rent DVD's, boiling pots of meat, small eateries, an old woman selling bananas, a young girl braiding hair, a traditional healer, a traditional beer purveyor, teenagers with blaring boom boxes, children playing soccer. Roadside vendors are all over the place, selling what we would consider rubbish. Old electrical items, bits of broken mobile phones, second hand toilet seats, old boots, recycled plastic, old clothes, empty margarine containers. As in any economically depressed place, crime is sky high and yet, people try and take care of each other.

Cindy and I are celebrities when we go to Dagoretti, well, at least to the children under 5. They follow us everywhere, want to hold our hands and shout "howayou" as we pass by.

We do not have any photos to share with you; pictures without knowing the people only illicit a poor Africa response. And Dagoretti is not "poor Africa" for here live the people we are privileged to serve. Here are good people, brothers and sisters with a strong commitment to their God and a faith that often puts mine to shame.

Talking Points for the Real Enforcement with Practical Answers for Immigration Reform (REPAIR) Proposal

- **The U.S. immigration system is broken and is in urgent need of reform.** An estimated 10.8 million people are living in the United States without lawful immigration status. The government detains hundreds of thousands of immigrants when more humane options are available. Countless families are torn apart by the current state of our immigration system; they wait years, even decades to reunify or are separated by stringent immigration laws.
- **If the federal government does not act, states will continue to take immigration policy into their own hands.** Arizona's new law places U.S. citizens and immigrants at risk of being interrogated, arrested or even jailed by local police. Instead of creating haphazard policies, states should pressure Congress to pass comprehensive immigration reform.
- **While not perfect, REPAIR represents a positive step towards comprehensive immigration reform and is based on bipartisan discussions between Senators Schumer (D-NY) and Graham (R-SC).** For comprehensive immigration reform to become law in 2010, the White House and congressional leaders from both parties must invest more time, energy and resources to finalize the details and sell their proposal to the American public.
- **REPAIR includes a number of significant reforms.**
 - **Earned pathway to legal status for eligible undocumented immigrants.**
 - Undocumented immigrants living in the United States would have to register with the U.S. government and apply for legal status and work authorization.
 - **Clearing of the family reunification backlogs.**
 - The proposal would clear the family reunification backlogs that keep millions of U.S. citizens and green card holders apart from their close family members for years or decades.
 - **Consideration of the welfare of children when making decisions about the detention, release or transfer of parents in immigration custody.**
 - Before immigrant parents are arrested, detained or transferred, the government currently does not give significant consideration to how these decisions would impact the children of these parents.
 - **Special protections for refugees and children seeking asylum.**
 - **DREAM Act (legalizing students) and AgJOBS (legalizing agricultural workers) and the permanent extension of the religious worker program (for clergy or key members of religious organizations).**
- **The proposal presents a long list of border security and interior enforcement measures.** To have a chance of passing Congress, any comprehensive immigration reform bill will need to convince the American public that the government is serious about ending illegal immigration. More work is needed to minimize the impact on families and communities and to ensure the inclusion of protections for refugees, asylum-seekers, survivors of torture, children, and other vulnerable migrants.

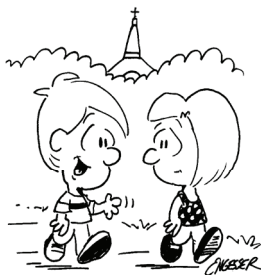

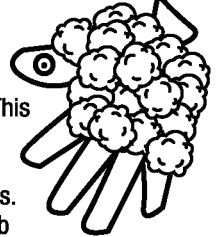

God can do great things with our gifts. This craft reminds us that every little coin counts. When your lamb is full, empty out the coins and give them to a charity or church mission program.



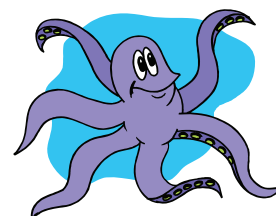
What you need:

- Knit glove (black or white)
- 1-foot-long piece of thin ribbon, any color
- Stapler
- Craft glue or hot glue gun
- Fiberfill or cotton balls
- 2 googly eyes

What you do:

1. Staple one end of the ribbon to the inside of each side of the glove's opening to make a hanger.
2. For the lamb's body, cover the palm and half of the thumb with glue. Stick the fiberfill or cotton balls onto the glue.
3. Glue a googly eye to each side of the mitten's thumb. (The other fingers will be the legs.)
4. Hang the lamb where you'll see it often. Whenever you have extra change, drop it into your lamb bag.

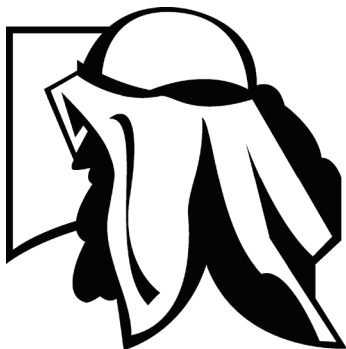
