### From the Pastor's Pen

By God's grace, we are in the city for good!

As a teenager, I attended a week-long leadership training where I wrote my very first personal mission statement. Right from the start, writing mission statements was a very compelling activity for me. Throughout the rest of my high school and college years, every six months or so, I would update my personal mission statement. Of course, during these critical developmental years of any person's life, goals and foci change with regularity. Even in these early years of my life, being clear about my objectives was helpful. So many of us ask: What am I doing with my life? Where am I going? What is the point? Well, writing a mission statement can give clarity to what we are doing day in, day out. And when we sit down to write a mission statement, we might realize—as I did—that our mission is not so much tied to a particular task or goal but to a way of being in the world, the hows instead of the whats. For instance, for me, when I wrote my personal mission statement, I was most concerned with being a person of integrity and a person of love than of doing anything in particular.

Once in a while, though, we get to do something that really embodies our mission. At Grace, our mission statement reads: By God's grace, we are in the city for good! You have probably all heard me say that we mean this in two ways. One, that we are here to stay for the long haul. We love our neighborhood and believe God has placed us here at 3rd Street and Moreland because God has a mission for us on this particular piece of real estate. Two, we are here to do good in Jesus' name, to be light and salt in the world.

Right now, we have the opportunity to be light and salt, to do good in a really particular way, and I invite each of you to discern how God may be calling us to serve God and God's people through this opportunity.

True North is a development corporation headed by a man named Jonathon Vento. When I met Jonathon, one of the first things he said to me was: I'm concerned about the gentrification of this neighborhood. And I said: Me too! He said: There is no affordable housing being planned in all this development happening in downtown Phoenix, yet this a perfect spot for affordable housing because of the light rail and the proximity of services. And thus began a conversation between Grace and True North that has resulted in a proposal for Grace to engage in a long-term lease with True North in order that they might build transitional housing for families exiting homelessness. This housing would be managed by the nonprofit Homeward Bound; providing this type of housing—along with necessary services—is all Homeward Bound does. The proposed lease would be for the portion of our land on which the playground and parsonage now sit.

Please come and learn about this project, a project called the Urban Sanctuary. We will have two information meetings and one voting meeting.

# Synod Assembly June 9-10

Voting members from all the congregations of the Grand Canyon Synod will meet in assembly on June 9-10 at Love of Christ Lutheran Church in Mesa. As you may remember, our synodical bishop Steve Talmage will be concluding his term as bishop one year early, and this year's assembly will include time to discern as a synod what the role of the bishop ought to be. As well, we will learn together about the state of seminary education and leadership in a changing church. Currently, there are about 9,000 pastors serving in the ELCA. Due to the retirement of the Baby Boomers, by 2019, the ELCA is estimating that the total number of clergy will be down to 6,000 pastors. Voting members from Grace will include Renee Waterstradt, Brian Flatgard, Frankie Ark, and Pastor Sarah. Judy Baker, as a member of the synod council, will also serve as a voting member.

#### Diakonia

This coming fall, the Grand Canyon Synod of the ELCA will be running a pilot session of the Diakonia program in central Phoenix. This is a two-year course in the Bible, church history, theology, ethics, and leadership for lay people. The cost per year is \$360 plus books. The program does not lead to seminary or serving on the roster of the ELCA but is meant to equip lay church leaders for service and leadership in their congregation. #### Pastor Sarah's Sabbatical

Pastor Sarah will be going on sabbatical July 10-September 9. If you have not had a chance to hear about what a sabbatical is or why it is taken, here's a snapshot.

About 15-20 years ago, the ELCA noticed a trend of pastors serving congregations 5-7 years and then seeking a new call. Through research, they discovered that the reason for the short length of call was burnout. Pastors were simply burned out after years of being on-call and working 50-65 hour weeks, with only 4 weekends off a year in a culture where almost all family gatherings and social events happen on weekends. What came from this finding was encouraging congregations of the ELCA to offer a sabbatical to their pastor after she/he had served in the congregation 5-7 years. In the ELCA, a typical sabbatical is 3 months long and does not replace regular vacation time. The hope through the sabbatical is that the pastor will remain in their call longer and be healthier which, in turn, leads to healthier congregations.

After 6 1/2 years at Grace, Pastor Sarah will be taking a 2 month sabbatical. Most of the Sunday worship services during her sabbatical will be led by Pastor Mary Louise Frenchman; worship on July 30 and August 27 will be led and preached at by members of Grace.

Our lay communion ministers Bev Zannos, Barb Buta, and Nancy Tickle will continue to visit homebound members, and Margie Betz and Linda Erickson will visit those in the hospital as well as a couple of the outlying homebound members. Clergy will be available in emergencies, such as death, accidents, or other emergencies.
