From the Pastor's Pen

Continue to live your lives in Christ Jesus, rooted and built up in Christ and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

– Colossians 2:6-7

I never thought I would buy a house. I dislike material possessions in general, and a house seems to me to be the largest of all material possessions. However, as I searched for a new place to live, I realized my soul needs outdoor space, and I would like to get closer to my food production by gardening and keeping chickens. Now, despite my life-long renunciation of home ownership, I have purchased a home about two miles from Grace—a good biking distance.

In the midst of my housing search and purchase, what kept rolling around my head was this phrase from scripture: rooted and built up in Christ. As a pastor's kid who became a pastor, one of the things I had always assumed about my life is that I wouldn't ever get attached to any one place. I assumed I would forever be moving from place to place as pastors do, five years here, eight years there, and so on. But I have found that the people of Grace and the ministry we do together has not only gotten under my skin but made its way into my heart in a way that surprises me. I am rooted here now. It's hard to imagine being anywhere else.

And while the day may come—hopefully, a long time from now—when I will no longer be the pastor here at Grace, I will never be uprooted from the body of Christ. Through my baptism and, indeed, through your baptism, you and I were rooted and built up in Christ. Now, we are rooted and built up in Christ through the community. It is the people of God who come to worship and with whom we share the peace, the people with whom we hear and study scripture, the people with whom we laugh and cry, the people for whom we pray and who pray for us who root us and ground us. Because Christ is now at work in our hands and our feet, the community here is what keeps us rooted and grounded. As we move through May, a month full of celebration and transition, the role of community is important. Because we the body of Christ together, we rejoice with one another as young adults graduate from college and as children are baptized, as mothers are honored and cross-generational relationships celebrated. We also grieve with one another and support each other as members of our community walk through difficult times.

In a quickly-changing and ever-changing world, we need a community where we are rooted and grounded. That is part—a large part—of why the church exists: for the sake of community. Ultimately, of course, it is Christ in whom we are rooted and grounded, but one of the primary ways we know Christ is through others' hands and feet. So, I encourage you this month to stay rooted and grounded and to root and ground others by being in community with one another.
